Ronald Doncaster provided an updated on the following:

Organizational Health Assessment Strategic Plan (OHA)

- o A draft of the Strategic Plan was presented to Ms. Davis. The OHA is scheduled to presented at the Health Care District Board Meeting in June 2025.

- Ron has a town hall meeting, “Coffee and Donuts”, at Padgett Island, in June 2025.

- **Outmigration/Surgical Services**

They are currently reviewing patient transfers and the underlying reasons for each case. Dr. Medard has taken the lead on this initiative and is actively engaging with the OR and ICU teams through a series of meetings.

Approximately two weeks ago, a meeting was held with staff to discuss the two surgeons based at LMC. During this meeting, participants planned and explored strategies to facilitate introductions and foster collaboration between the surgeons and clinicians within the community.

Ron reported that, of the two surgeons, one was not initially credentialed and did not have active insurance coverage. He confirmed that this issue has since been resolved and the surgeon is now properly insured.

Ms. Jackson-Moore inquired about the current census, and Ron reported that it stands at 12 as of today. She also requested information on the patient payer mix. Ron responded that approximately 40% to 50% of patients are private pay, while around 30% are covered by Medicare.

Caroline Villanueva requested a census trend report for the past year, including patient percentages by category and payer type.

The Board Members were given an opportunity to ask questions.

 - Conducted every 3 years
 - Understand health status needs of the community
 - Highlight priorities and health factors
 - Engage stakeholders and community members
 - Inform the development of the implementation strategy
- Implementation Strategy
 - Developed following the CHNA
 - Seeks to address priority issues identified in the CHA
 - Sets measurable objectives and track process over time

- Data to Action: CHNA and Implementation Plans
- CHNAs Provide Opportunities
- The Process is Centered on Community Engagement
- CHNA – Identifies and documents community health needs
