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Health Care District Leaders Participate in Opioid Healthcare Response Recommendation

The Palm Beach County Medical Society and Healthcare Emergency Response Coalition (HERC) rolled out its joint recommendations to reduce the number of opioid deaths in the county at a meeting in West Palm Beach on Friday, May 18, 2018. The Health Care District was actively involved in the Opioid Healthcare Response Task Force that met over a six-month period to devise a comprehensive, evidence-based strategy that recognizes addiction as a medical illness. The meeting drew health care leaders and officials from across the county and nation.
